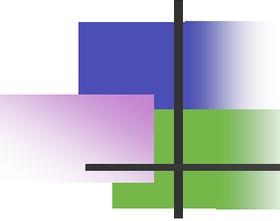


MA Library Updates for FY2023 and FY2024



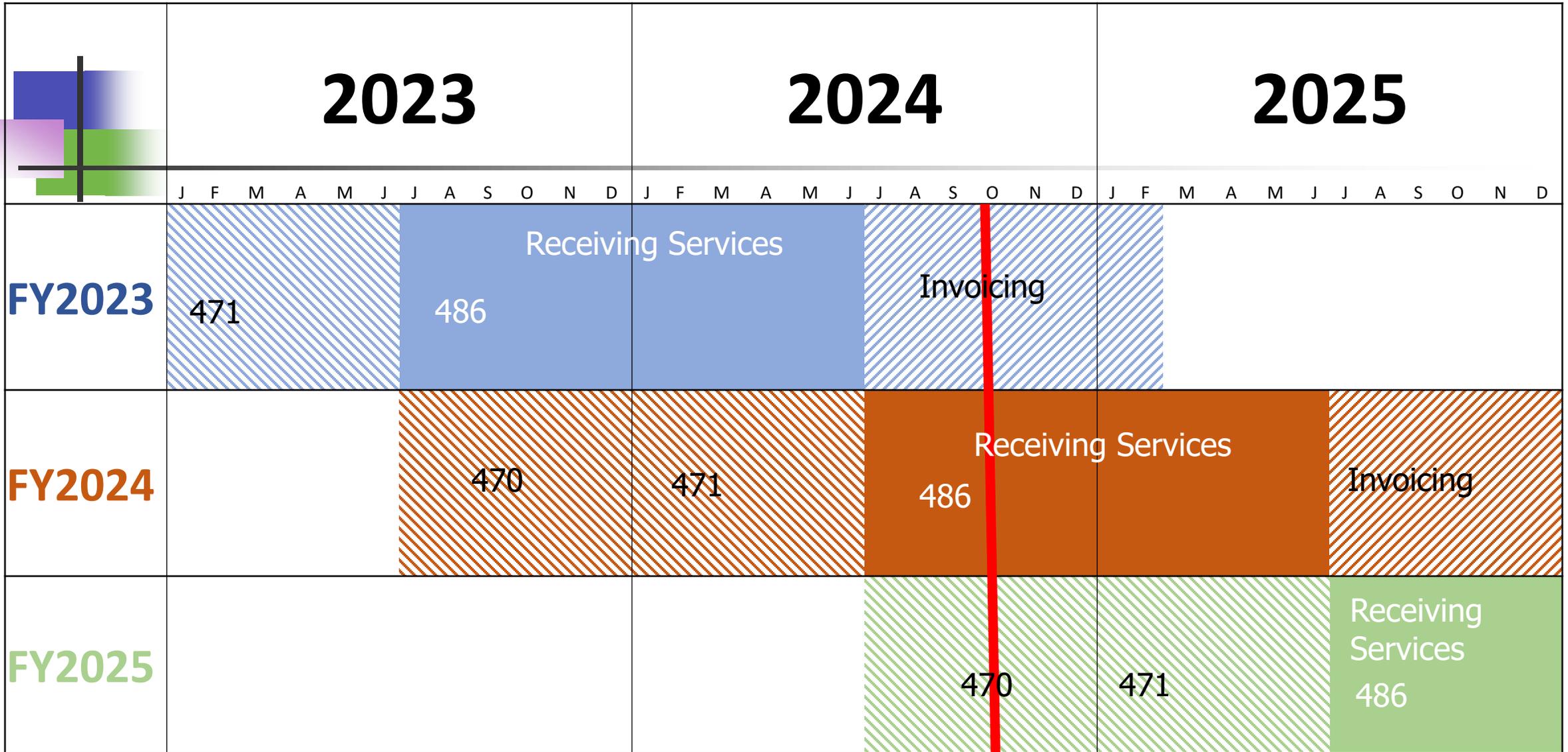
Application Steps and Deadlines

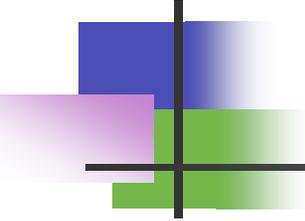
- E-rate requires annual applications
- Funding years mostly don't overlap, but application processes do
- Important to remember where you are in the process for each funding year



Application Process in a Nutshell

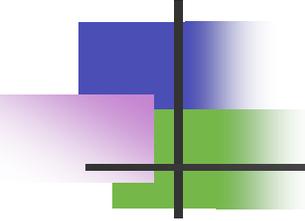
- Procurement: **Form 470** and (optional) RFP
 - Bid Evaluation and Contract Award
- Application for Funding: **Form 471**
 - PIA review and award of funding (FCDL)
- Notification of Services Starting: **Form 486**
 - Receipt of services and compliance with CIPA
- Invoicing: **BEAR (Form 472)** or **SPI (Form 474)**
- Post-Invoicing: Audits, reviews, etc.





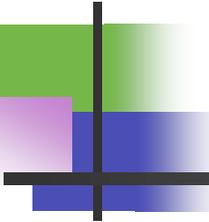
Program Overview: MA Libraries

- FY2023 Stats (as of 9/28/2024)
 - Funding Requests
 - 21 Funding Requests Approved
 - \$597,879.30 in commitments
 - 20 Funding Requests have already had invoices filed
 - \$573,652.58 already disbursed

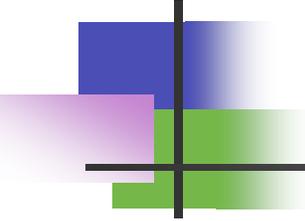


Program Overview: MA Libraries

- FY2024 Stats (as of 9/28/2024)
 - Funding Requests
 - 23 Funding Requests Filed
 - 1 Funding Request Cancelled
 - 1 Funding Request Under Review
 - \$933,253.46 approved and committed
 - Forms 486
 - Of 20 Funded FRNs, all 20 are covered by filed and certified Forms 486

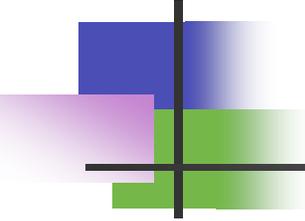


What's New: Hotspots and Cybersecurity Pilot Program



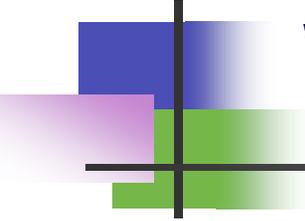
Review of Eligible Services

- Eligible services divided into two categories:
 - Category 1 (Data and Internet) Services
 - Category 2 (Internal connections, Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections, Managed Internal Broadband Services)
- Eligible services list revised each year
 - ESL draft for FY2025 will have minor changes, mostly around the addition of Wi-Fi hotspots



Review of Eligible Services: C1

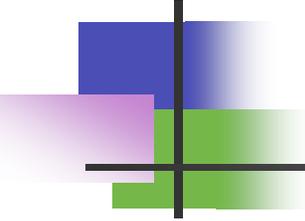
- Category 1 (Data and Internet) Services
 - Ethernet Service
 - Leased Dark Fiber
 - Leased Lit Fiber
 - Self Provisioned Broadband Networks
 - T-1, T-3, OC-1, OC-3, etc.
 - Cable modem, DSL
 - Wireless Data Services*
 - Satellite
 - Terminating network equipment
 - **Wi-Fi Hotspots for Off-Premise Use**



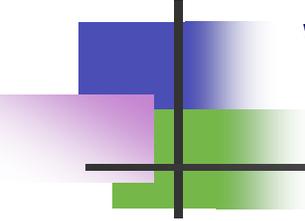
Wi-Fi Hotspots

- Wi-Fi Hotspots for off-premises use
 - Wi-Fi hotspots available in the new 470
 - Available for off-premises use only
 - Must be commercially available, portable, single devices
 - Does not include aircards, service for devices (smartphones, laptops, etc.) or any network equipment beyond the hotspot itself
 - Each hotspot device must have a line of service
 - No warehousing of devices
 - Budget limitation and device limitation in place for Wi-Fi hotspots (separate from C2 budget) – strict limitations on how much E-rate will cover
 - CIPA attaches with hotspots because they provide Internet access

Wi-Fi Hotspots

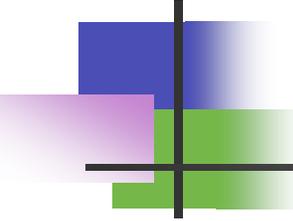


- Wi-Fi Hotspots for off-premises use (cont'd)
 - Must go through the traditional Form 470 process
 - No grandfathering of existing contracts
 - Hotspots require updated AUPs stating that off-premises use must be primarily for an educational purpose
 - For libraries, AUP must state that the use be “integral, immediate, and proximate to the provision of library services to library patrons”
 - Must go through public notice and post updated AUP
 - Libraries are required to put in place content and other restrictions similar to what is used on-premises for off-premises devices (it is expected that service providers will help with this)
 - As always, filtering/CIPA only applies to library-owned computers – not the hotspots themselves



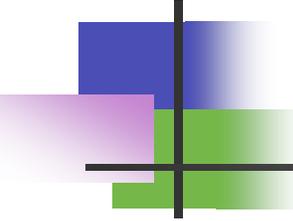
Wi-Fi Hotspots

- Wi-Fi Hotspots for off-premises use (cont'd)
 - No duplicative funding
 - Recordkeeping requirements
 - Similar to ECF (make/model, serial, dates of loans/when informed damaged or missing or lost, service details)
 - BUT: no need for signed documentation from patrons
 - Usage requirements: must be used within each 90 day period
 - Service providers required to cut off service if not used
 - Service providers required to provide reports showing non-usage to allow library to fix



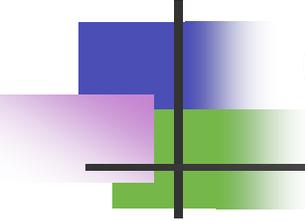
Cybersecurity Pilot Program (CPP/CBR)

- Funds Advanced/Next-Gen Firewalls, Endpoint Protection, Identify Protection and Authentication, Monitoring/Detection/Response
 - All CPP services are ineligible for E-rate – if eligible for E-rate, then not eligible for CPP
- Requires CIPA compliance
- Application Process similar to E-rate, with some wrinkles:
 - Form 484-1, then a selection process
 - If selected, Form 470, Form 471 and Form 484-2, then invoicing
 - Application is through EPC portal
 - No grandfathered contracts unless they went through the E-rate process



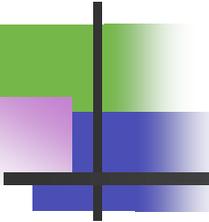
Cybersecurity Pilot Program (CPP/CBR)

- Form 484-1 window opened 9/17/2024, closes 11/1/2024
- Form 484-1 seeks basic information about your “cybersecurity posture” – i.e. the various measures you are taking for cybersecurity
 - Also seeks information on how those measures align with the recommendations of CISA (which are for schools, but relevant; see <https://www.cisa.gov/online-toolkit-partnering-safeguard-k-12-organizations-cybersecurity-threats>)
- Timeframe post 484-1 unclear, but anticipated 470s could be released before end of 2024 with funding assigned in Spring 2025

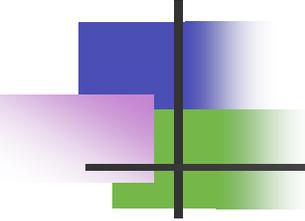

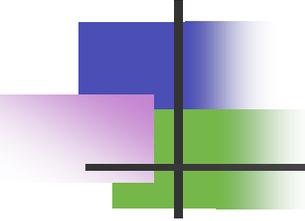

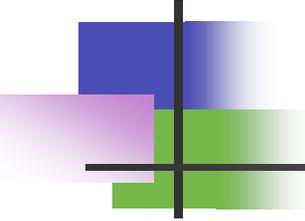
Preparing for FY2025

- Many things libraries can do now in advance of filing a Form 470



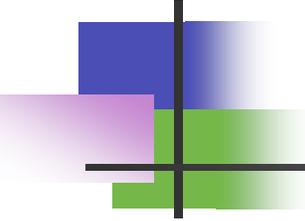
Preparing for FY2025

- Determine current status of services
 - Current services and specifications
 - Current needs
 - Contract Status
- Before filing a Form 470, libraries must know what services on which they want to seek bids
 - Category 1 – Data and Internet Access
 - Category 2 – Internal Connections, Basic Maintenance of Internal Connections, and Managed Internal Broadband Services



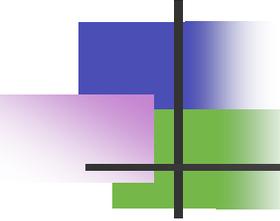
Prepare for Procurement

- Procurement process must be “fair and open”
 - Fair: every vendor evaluated fairly and equally
 - Open: same information available to all potential vendors
- This is the most critical part of the E-rate process
 - Difficult to remedy errors
 - Remediation usually involves starting over – which is a problem since you normally only find out about problems after it’s too late to start over
- **DO NOT GET VENDOR ASSISTANCE WITH PROCUREMENT**



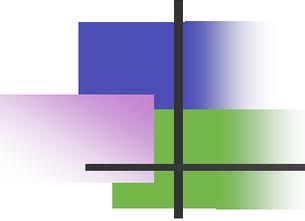
Procurement: Options

- Option 1: Just file a 470 (no RFP)
- Option 2: File a 470 and RFP
- Option 3: Use State Contract
- Option 4: Use CABIO or Tribal Libraries Exception



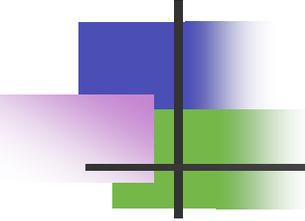
Procurement Option 1: Form 470

- Form 470 filing formally starts the bidding process
 - Includes services and quantities you're seeking
 - Can provide links or other information to bidding requirements and can provide narrative
- If outside documents need to be attached, see Option 2



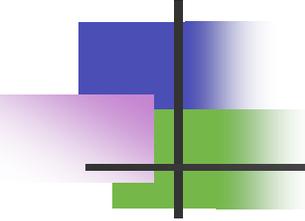
Procurement Option 2: 470 and RFP

- Request for Proposal (RFP) used in the E-rate process to specify needs and requirements in greater detail
 - Term “RFP” applies to ***any*** document/information that clarifies or modifies the requirements expressed in the Form 470
 - RFP is optional in E-rate – may be required based on local needs
 - Any and all RFP documents must be included
 - As new documents created (e.g. Q&A), must be attached
 - Updates can reset the 28 day clock if they are “significant”



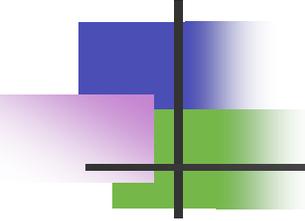
Procurement Option 2: 470 and RFP

- If you want to prepare an RFP, talk with us
 - Hundreds of RFPs available online and through EPC
 - Some sample RFPs available via MBLC
- More to say in October
 - Standard RFP components
 - Suggested RFP requirements



Procurement Option 3: State Contract

- State Contract (ITT72) exists that allows libraries to bypass the Form 470 process
- Must still conduct a mini-bid process comparing the various vendors awarded under ITT72

 - Includes instructions, attachments, etc.

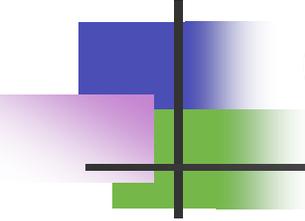


Procurement Option 4: CABIO

- C1: Commercially Available Business class Internet Option (CABIO), aka “Low Cost, High Speed Internet Access”
 - Requirements:
 - Speed of at least 100 Mbps down/10 Mbps up
 - Commercially available to all non-residential customers at same price and terms
 - Must cost \$3,600/yr. per library (or less) including any one-time charges
 - Examples: Comcast Business Fiber, Verizon Fios
 - Does not require procurement or bid evaluation process. Does require creating a contract record and Form 471
 - Library does need to certify that they have used a CABIO process on the Form 471

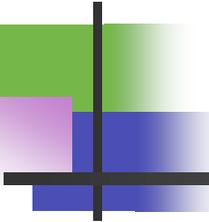
Procurement Option 4: Tribal Libraries Exception

- C2: The Tribal Libraries Exception
 - Applies to all libraries, not just Tribal Libraries
 - Up to \$3,600 in C2 can be sought each year for each library outlet without needing to file a Form 470
 - Cannot be aggregated across library outlets
 - Library does not need to conduct procurement/470 process or bid evaluation

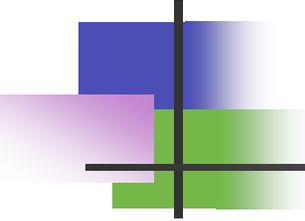


Category 2 Budgets

- Category 2 services are constrained by a pre-discount C2 budget
- FY2025 is the final year of the current C2 budget cycle
 - Current cycle total budget (pre-discount) is \$20,544,688.50
 - Current cycle total used (pre-discount) is \$1,501,265.83
 - Current cycle total remaining (pre-discount) is \$19,043,402.67
